You are receiving this email because you have selected Option #1: Continuum of Learning for your child. Please read through this email carefully as it contains important information that will help everyone understand details related to the return to school for in-person instruction.

“A” or “B” Day Group Designation

Parents/Guardians were emailed information on December 16, 2020 with the “A” or “B” group designation indicated.

- “A” Group students will attend school for in-person instruction on Mondays and Tuesdays beginning on Tuesday, January 19, 2021.
- “B” Group students will attend school for in-person instruction on Thursdays and Fridays beginning on Thursday, January 21, 2021.

“A” Day Students: First day of in-person instruction will be Tuesday, January 19, 2021.

“B” Day Students: First day of in-person instruction will be Thursday, January 21, 2021.

Attendance

Whether students are on the Continuum (Option #1) or in Poquoson Online (Option #2), they are expected to be participating in live learning four days a week, with Wednesday used for assignment completion, remediation, and asynchronous work in designated classes. Students in “A” or “B” groups will attend school for in-person instruction two days each week.

Parents/guardians are responsible for emailing the school attendance clerk and the student’s teacher if the student will not be participating in learning that day (whether in-person or virtual).

If the parent/guardian calls to notify the school of the absence, the parent must provide electronic or hard copy documentation of the absence within five (5) days of the absence.

An undocumented absence from learning is considered an unexcused absence.

The student is responsible for coordinating with the teacher to make-up any work that is missed.

At-Home Virtual Learning Days

On days when students on the Continuum are learning virtually from home (Thursdays/Fridays for A group students and Mondays/Tuesdays for B group students), students should:

- Log on to Google Meet a few minutes before the start time to be ready to begin class on time.
- Upon entry into class, turn the Chromebook camera on and leave the camera on unless directed otherwise by the teacher.
- Upon entry into class, mute the microphone.

Materials and Supplies

Students will not be assigned a locker. Therefore, they can carry their backpacks from class to class throughout the day. Students will not be permitted to share materials and should come prepared with their own notebooks, paper, pens, pencils, etc. Students should bring the materials they are currently using for class with them when they come to school, including their Chromebook with a charging cord.

Student Chromebooks, Chargers, and Earbuds

Students who are coming to school for in-person instruction will bring their fully-charged Chromebook, charger, and earbuds each day.

Water Bottles & Snacks

Students are encouraged to bring their own water each day as the water fountains and bottle filling stations have been turned off in all schools and offices. Students are encouraged to bring a small snack (i.e., piece of fruit, granola bar, energy bar, etc.) to have at the end of the second block each day.

Student Orientation and Information Videos

This Thursday, January 14, 2021 and Friday, January 15, 2021, all students will watch an orientation video during their English class. This will include time for questions with teachers.

Health & Safety Information

Masks or Face Coverings

Students and staff are required to wear a mask at all times.

- Students are asked to wear a clean, school appropriate mask each day.
- If a mask is misplaced or forgotten, the school will provide a disposable one.
- Periodic mask breaks during the day will be provided for students in a safe and controlled manner.

Physical Distancing

Students are reminded to maintain at least 6 feet of physical distance whenever possible. This includes hallways, restrooms and buses.

Washing of Hands and Use of Hand Sanitizer

While the use of hand sanitizer is encouraged whenever possible, students are asked to wash their hands as frequently as needed while at school. Hand sanitizer is available in every teacher's classroom and all office spaces. Students are asked to use hand sanitizer when they enter and exit a classroom.

Cleaning and Sanitizing

When leaving a classroom, each student will wipe down his or her own desk area, to include the desktop and chair.

- Non-latex gloves are available for any student who may need one.
- Wipes are deposited in the trash can as the student leaves the classroom.

Restrooms

In an effort to ensure physical distancing, only one student will be allowed out of the classroom at a time to use the restroom. If there are more than the allowed number of students in the restroom when a student arrives, the student is asked to wait outside of the restroom until another student exits the restroom. Teachers will review this process with students. Restrooms will be closed during class changes.

Daily Health Screenings

A digital health screener text message will be sent each morning to the student's cell phone or the parent that is listed as the first contact (whichever option was selected by families). Students and/or parents are asked to respond to the health screener questions and submit their response *prior* to the student coming to school.

It is imperative that this health screening is completed prior to arrival to ensure students are able to attend class on time. Students will not be permitted to go to class until the health screening is complete.

As a part of our daily health screening process, temperatures will be taken for each student when they arrive on campus. Any student with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will be rescreened by the school nurse and sent home with a recommendation to consult with a health professional.

Morning Arrival

The arrival time for parent drop-off and walkers is 7:05 am. **Students will not be granted entry until this time.** These students (parent drop-off and walkers) will enter through the main entry of the building. Student drivers will enter through the gym doors. Parents are asked to review the Parent Drop-Off procedures prior to Tuesday, January 19, 2021. Click [HERE](#) to review this information.

Afternoon Departure

Students will be dismissed in two phases. At 1:00pm, all 11th and 12th grade students will be dismissed and student drivers will exit the parking lot (or wait in a vehicle for younger siblings, if necessary). At 1:10pm, all 9th and 10th grade students will be dismissed to head to their busses or ride home. Students will report directly to their bus or the parent pick-up loop. Students will have the opportunity to grab a free lunch to take home with them on their way out. Parents are asked to review the Parent Pick-Up procedures prior to Monday, December 7th. Bus Schedule

Bus routes are listed in the [Transportation section of our division webpage](#). Specific bus information will be emailed to parents by the end of this week.

Physical distancing requirements do restrict the number of students who can be on a bus at one time. Because of this, bus passes will not be granted this year. Students are expected to ride their assigned bus home to their designated stop each day they attend school for in-person instruction.

Any student whose parent did not complete the Transportation Survey request in November has not been assigned a bus route to and from school; therefore, the parent is responsible for providing transportation on each in-person school day for their child.

Parents, Visitors, Guests, and Volunteers

Non-essential visitors and guests will not be allowed to enter the schools, offices, or division buildings. PCPS is not allowing volunteers into the buildings or classrooms at this time. Parents should report to the PHS Main Entrance for meetings. A mask is required at all times by all parents.
